Description

Description: Recombinant Canine PD-1 protein with C-terminal 10×His tag

Background : Programmed cell death protein 1 (PDCD1) is an immune-inhibitory receptor expressed in activated T cells; it is involved in the regulation of T-cell functions, including those of effector CD8 T cells. In addition, this protein can also promote the differentiation of CD4 T cells into T regulatory cells. PDCD1 is expressed in many types of tumors including melanomas, and has demonstrated to play a role in anti-tumor immunity. Moreover, this protein has been shown to be involved in safeguarding against autoimmunity, however, it can also contribute to the inhibition of effective anti-tumor and anti-microbial immunity.

Molecular Characterization: mass of 17.5 kDa after removal of the signal peptide. The apparent molecular mass of dPD-1-His is approximately 15-35 kDa due to glycosylation.

Purification: The purity of the protein is greater than 85% as determined by SDS-PAGE and Coomassie blue

staining.

Content: Lyophilized from sterile PBS, pH 7.4. Normally 5 % - 8% trehalose is added as protectants before

lyophilization.

Store at -20°C to -80°C for 12 months in lyophilized form. After reconstitution, if not intended

for use within a month, aliquot and store at -80°C (Avoid repeated freezing and thawing).

Lyophilized proteins are shipped at ambient temperature.




Figure 1. Canine PD-1 Protein, His Tag on SDS-PAGE under reducing condition.



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


Figure 2. ELISA plate pre-coated by 2 $\hat{1}\frac{1}{4}$ g/mL (100 $\hat{1}\frac{1}{4}$ L/well) Canine PD-1 Protein, His Tag can bind Anti-Canine PD-1(INTERVET 4F12) mAb in a linear range of 0.64-80 ng/mL.




Figure 3. Flow cytometry analysis with 15μg/mL Canine PD-1 Protein, His Tag on Expi293 cells transfected with Canine PD-L1 protein (Blue histogram) or Expi293 transfected with irrelevant protein (Red histogram).
